An eye witness wrote: On Sunday, the th of June, 1846, the Conclave of Carinals met for the election of a new We went to Montecavailo to see choice is made. Two ballots are had daily, at 10 A. M and 6 P. M., till some one is found to have a majority. The ambassaders of France and Austria have each one vote. The ballots are burned when there is no choice, and the people meet on Quirinal Hill to watch a certain

chimney whence the smoke of the ballots issue annourcing no election. Along the path the cardinals were to pass, the pavement was strewn with red sand. Soldiers lined the way, and a band of music played at intervals to amuse the expectant crowd on the square before the palace. The roofs and windows of neighboring palaces were filled with people. For nearly two hours there was much movement of troops, footmen and liveried servants in long coats of many colors trimmed with coach lace. Presently the carriage of Prince Chigi, marshal of the conclave, appeared, and two or three others containing cardinals. To these the troops presented arms. A squadron of horse and several companies of infantry preceded the procession of priests and

printed leaf held in his hand, while a page supported his train. There were forty-seven cardinals walking two by two, and between each pair were several priests dressed in black. A double file of infantry closed the line. Besides these forty seven cardinals and others had already gone to the palace. There were sixty-three in all, of whom fifty four were clad in purple and were created by the late Pope, and nine clad in green robes, were created by the two preceding Popes. > crowd dispersed. On Wednesday morning at 6 o'clock we went again to the Quirinal, for all the previous night the uproar throughout the city gaven token that an election had been made on the second ballot of Tuesday. The square before the palace was densely thronged. It is the custom during a conclave for a great number of priests to go every morning to the palace inquiring whether an election has been made. At 7.30 this procession of priests, friars and monks appeared, bearing crosses and bankers and chanting dolefully.

> the most part very jolly. At last, about 9:30 o'clock, the papal standard was brought out of a window and planted on the battlements of a low. castellated projection of the palace by the side of the window through which the pope was to appear. A tremendous shout greeted its appearance. The standard is of silk in nine stripes. Blue pink and orange alternate, with a red stripe in the first orange stripe, and the papal arms wrought in a gold circle ever the second erange stripe. The staff is surmounted by three gold balls. At the some time a pecking of hammers was heard at the

> In a few minutes the bricks were removed, several cardinals appeared on the balcony, one of whom read from a paper that 'the most illustrous and reverend Cardinal Mastai was elected Pope and had taken the name of Pio Nono.' Waving of handkerchiefs and deafening cheers from the multitude below hailed this announcement, the cardinals on the balcony uniting in the domenstration by clapping their hands. At this moment a small black pipe on the roof of the Conservatore sent forth a cloud of incense which lasted two or three minutes, the guns from the St. Angelo opened fire, the military struck up and the plaudits of the people resounded through the city. A stir on the balcony and a brushing away of the dust from its railing by the handkerchiefs of the cardinals announced the approach of the new Pontiff. A tremendous shout welcomed him. He wore a scarlet robe richly decorated with gold, and came out bareheaded, holding a handkerchief to his face.
