All who heard the a dress of Rev. Mi Millingen, on Monday afterneon, learned something of the war, its origin, phase. and probable result, which they did not previously know, and of which it is difficult to learn accurately and precisely We have read much of Turkish matters within the past few months, but Mr Millingen has summed up the situation in a nut-shell. He considered the Eastern Ques ion under two heads, (1) the conflict between the Turkish Government and its Christian subjects. (2) the conflict between the several European Powers for the maintenance of their respective interests in connexion with the downfall of the Turkish State, Th former conflict is due, first, to the un sound political principle on which the Turkish Government is based, viz , tha the full rights of citizenship in the Turk ish State shall belong to Moslems, while Christians shall occupy an inferior pesttion-church membership, so speak, is the condition of citizenship secondly, to the oppressive exactions of the Turkish administration, due to the sale of offices, and to the farming of the taxes, officials thus being tempted to make their administration a commercial specu lation; thirdly, to the incongruity of a superior civilization being subject to a civilization which is in many points its inferior. The Christian subjects of the Turkish Government are ac cordingly, in this E-opire, worthy of the sympathy of all who love freedom. Unsier the second head, Mr. Millingen said that if Russia will not as the champion of the oppressed Christians in Turkey, tmany of whom she is bound by the ties of race and religion, then Russia will be entitled to the greatest admiration. Mr. Millingen regretted that Great B. itain and all other European Powers had not united with Russia in compelling the just treatment of Christians by the Turks, or in securing their emancipation from the Turkish yoke. 
