Little Rock, Ark., May 5.—About four weeks ago Colonel Smithe, State Land Commissioner, and Associated Press agent at this point started a Democratic paper and immediately a rather spirited o nir sersy string up between the reliable Democratic organ, which finally degenerated into a personal controversy between Colonel Smithe, of the Democrat (Sundays excepted) at 6:30 and 2 p.m., making close connections with the R. W. &O. Bailroad, Northern Syracuse Railroad and N. Y. C. Railroad, Pullman Cars East and West.

RETURNING—Wi'lleave Cape Vincent on arrival of Trains at 10 a.m. and 6 p.m., connecting with G.T.R., Royal Mail Line, and Bay of Quinte Steamers at Kingston. and Major John D. Adams, Sr. probeen going on for a week in the columns of their respective newspapers over their signatures. Major Adams charged that Smithe, eight years ago, while foremen in the Gazette job office, stole some important manuscript from the office, and then charged a young man in the office with having stolen it, and procuring the discharge of the young man. This Smithe denied in a published letter, and Adams age in reiterated the charge in yesterday morning's Quette, In last night's Democrat Smithe replies as follows:

"There is no alternative but for me pronounce John D. Adams a liar, in whom there is no truth; a corrupter of men as he is a notorious debaucher of women; a slanderer who is purse-proud enough to suppose that his money can shield him from the consequence of his calumnies; a thing in human form, is whom there are elements which, when necessity requires, it will develope him into either a petty or first-class thief according to the size of the pile in his

When this appeared on the streets last night every one said that the affair would have to be settled according to the code, but nothing further was done about the matter until morning's Gazette appeared, which contained a long article from Adams, which concluded as follows:

"Smithe purloined the document ferred to, and then allowed an innocent boy to be accused of the offense, and saw him driven in diagrace from the Guzette office. An account of an infamous act of which Sunthe was guilty, he seeks by vile epithets and a general denial to defend Dupuis. himself. After publishing all the vile language he could command, like a

Major Adams also stated that Smithe's conduct had been such that he could not recognize him as a gentleman. Every one who knew Smithe said that it would not be long before Adams would learn of his whereabouts; that he was not one of the hiding kind. Therefore no one was surprised to see that Smithe was on the streets as usual this morning. As he came down Markham street, from the State House, about 10 o'clock, and just as he crossed Main street, he came face to face with Major Adams. As soon as Adams saw him he drew his revolver and cried to the bystanders to get out of the way, and commenced firing at Smithe. Almost simultaneously Smithe drew his "Cott" and fired. They were not more than fifteen feet apart; Smithe fired two shots and Adams three. At Smith's third attempt his pistol missed fire, and he threw it away and attempted to draw another pistol, when Adams' shot struck him in the right arm and paralyzed it. He then began to step backward, when another of Adams' shots struck him in the back, inflicting a slight flesh wound, and Smithe stumbled and fell. While lying there Adams ran up to him and said, "You d-d dog, I could kill you, but will act." · One of Smithe's shots struck Adams' hat rates. and tore a portion of the rim off. Both parties were taken off by their friends. Smithe's arm is paralyzed, some of the physicians say permanently. The affair has created great excitement here and several of the preachers alluded to it in their pulpits this morning as being disgraceful. Smithe and Adams are both


