SIR JOHN'S POLICY.

SIR JOHN'S "NATIONAL POLICY" IS COMMITTED TO THE POLICY OF LEAVING A TAX ON GRAIN AND COAL. SUCH A TAX WOULD RAISE THE PRICE OF EVERY TON OF COAL THE POOR MAN HAS TO BUY, AND EVERY LOAF OF BREAD HE EATS. THE TAX ON COAL WOULD ALSO INCREASE THE COST OF PRODUCTION—AN INCREASE IN THE COST OF PRODUCTION WOULD REDUCE THE PROFITS OF MANUFACTURERS—A REDUCTION OF THESE PROFITS WOULD LOWER THE RATE OF THE WORKINGMEN'S WAGES. IF AT THE SAME TIME WOULD RAISE THE PRICE OF FUEL TO
