The fact is that the financial year has yet nearly a month and a half to run, and that no one knows as yet what the precise expenditure of the year will amount to. The Finance Minister's estimate for 1877-78 was only \$23,373,228 59, and the actual expenditure will undoubtedly be somewhat less.
