Mr. Bymal also pointed to the fact that of the hundreds and thousands of farmers in Outario, "none had ever sent a petition there praying for the imposition of a duty on wheat." And when the grand Division of Grangers (which may be termed a farmers' parliament) met at Toronto, they discarded the idea of "protection to farmers"as being alike unwise and unpolitic, Indeed, it is but too obvious that the "spasmodic zeal for the interest of the farmer" was brought about by the political necessities of the Opposition. Mr. Rymal deserves the thanks of the whole country for his thorough exposure of the hollowness of the "protection" cry, and we commend his speech to the attentive perusal of all, and of farmers more especially. Speaking at a public meeting in Hamilton on last Saturday evening. Maud, Pierrepont and Geneva. Mr. Rymal ridiculed the Tory "protection" policy in a few pungent remarks .-Stratford Beacon.
