A Mysterious Case in East York.
About five years ago Mr. W. Hunter,
let of 2, York township, was informed that
a murder had been committed on the farm
upon which he was then residing, and that
the remains could still be found on the
premises. He at once started for the place,
21 years ago Mr. Hunter, who had then
years ago a house in the neighborhood, and
was never seen after. Rumor also credits a
visit to the same house by a neighbor
the third evening after the supposed
murder was committed, when he was met
by a person who informed him that he
had just buried the body in the vicinity.
Time passed, and Mr. Hunter paid little
attention to the story until a few days
ago, when he had occasion to visit one of
his fields. He then found in the exact
locality in which report had placed
the remains of a human skeleton which had apparently lain
there for some time. Mr. Hunter im-
mediately notified the Coroner, who, how-
ever, considered that no action was
necessary, the parties to the affair now
being dead. It is said the man is still liv-
ing, who, on the fatal night, went to visit
the house where the deed was done.
Upon reaching the door a disturbance in-
side attracted his attention, and peering
through the window he saw a man pass
out of the door, a woman leaning over
her husband and grasping his face, while
her husband was in the act of drawing
something across the throat of the cap-
tive. The interest in the case has again
revived with the discovery of the re-
mains, and it is expected that it will be an
occasion to tell fully his knowledge of the
whole proceeding.—Globe.
