guest of the Hon. Robert, C. Winthrop. In an interview he expressed great satisfaction with his visit, and said that the University reminded him of his own Alma Mater, Oxford. He referred very feelingly to the citizens of Canada, calling them,loyal, cultivated, and generous, and said that his six years residence in their midst was among the most pleasant of his life. He had been pleased to see that when war threatened the Mother country, Canadians, whatever may have been heir ancestry, were eager to rally to her defence. He had no fear of any Fenian invasion of the Dominion; any straggling invaders who crossed the lines would be sure of meeting with a warm reception. even those of the same race as the inimical brotherhood sympathizing the least with the movement, and being among the first to express a willingness to march to repel the invaders. Besides, the relations between the United States and Canada were such that he apprehended no serious disturbance at any time. A greater source of danger seemed to him to be the large number of trampe that had been turned loose to prey upon industrious persons. He cousidered the question concerning them a perplexing problem, and one that the American people must solve to protect themselves. He hoped for peace in Europe, deprecating a war between Russia and England as fearful to contemplate. The efforts of Earl Beaconsfield he characterized as among the greatest achievements of that illustrious statesman, and if war were averted it would, in a great degree, be due to his skilful diplomacy. If the interests of Europe were protected, and an honourable peace maintained, the Con-

gress will be remembered as one of the great events of history. The Earl said that there was no truth in the rumour that his term of office was to be extended. His family and household effects had already been sent to England, and he himself would sail in September.

Reference was made to the warm feelng that existed for the Earl among the citizens of the United States to which he replied that he heartily reciprocated it, and had found by repeated experiences how nearly one in sentiment were the Americans and the Canadians. English Law Reforms.

The Law Times alludes as follows to the Reform Bill of the Actorney-General for England, introduced into the House of Commons: "To abolish the distinction between felonies and misdemeanors; those who commit them are to be put on the same foeting, and be called by the same 'ugly name;' there is to be adiminution of maximum punishments-the nature of the crime and the circumstances of its commission are to effect the quantum of punishment which can be a warded; all mention of malice is to be omitted from definitions of offences; construcive murders are abolished, and that man is alone to be adjudged to death who does acts which cause death, being utterly indifferent to results. Provocation is defined as being the existance of circumstances depriving a man of his self-cortrol. A woman killing her child at, or immediately after birth, may be found guilty of manslaughter only. But destroying the life which may exist in a child not fully born is made an offense punishable with penal servitude for life. Then as to larceny -every specsies of determinate property, subject to certain necessary conditions, is declared to be subject to the law of larceny. Considerable improvements are made in the law relating to forgery. The part of the code which deals with procedure provides for only one course of proceeding in all cases. All subtleties as to venue are got rid of. An accused, who is indicted, instead of being taken before a magistrate, is toreceive simple notice. The Court is to have power to change a place of trial as in a civil action, and to direct the proceedings to be carried on as if they were in a civil action. Proceedings in error are made plain and simple, and an application for a new trial is to be allowed with certain conditions, and the Court of Appeals may, if it thinks fit, allow an ppeal to the House of Lords.
