HARD LINES.—An effort was made on Monday by a prominent shipper of Toronto to further reduce the rate for grain to Kingston. He wished to load a vessel with grain at 1c, but fortunately failed to do so.

INSPECTION.—Yesterday the Cavalry were inspected and complimented on their excellent appearance. The Picton Cavalry have returned home, and the Frontenac regiment will disperse to their homes to-morrow.

THE BOATS.—Six shells, belonging to the yachtsmen who pull at Cape Vincent to-morrow, went over by the Geneva this evening—at the same time that the owners, (Hanlan, Plaisted, McKen, Elliott, Luther and Kennedy) crossed the channel.

ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.—Last evening the monthly meeting was well attended. The date of the picnic of the Society was settled upon, and the arrangements to be proceeded forthwith most vigorously. The proposed gala day was abandoned, and the picnic plan of proceeding years adopted.

It struck the east chimney, following the edge of the roof to the eaves, scattering the bricks, shingles and clapboards, and giving the house and inmates a general shaking.

The maxima readings respectively were 88.8 and 87.9 and the minima 76.3 70.8 and 68.3.

Such high temperature has only been recorded once before, in the week ending June 12, 76, although in both August 1876 and also in 1877 we had temperature ranging from 80 to 86 for maxima, but the average of the last three days is the highest I have recorded in Kingston since I began the observations in 1871.

ROBBERY. —Mr. Kennedy, proprietor of the hotel bearing his name, situated at the corner of Brock and Ontario Streets, was yesterday robbed of a very large sum of money. About eleven o'clock on Tuesday he hung his coat in the bar, his pocket book containing about \$125 in bills, drafts representing \$1,000, and notes payable to him equivalent to \$500. Singular to say Mr. Kennedy thought no more of his coat until this morning, when he missed the pocket book. The coat was not where he had left it; he found it hanging in a hall between the kitchen and the bar. Detective Macaulay took the case in hand, but so far he has been unable to make anything out of it, nearly a day's start being given the thief, who by this time has no doubt made himself scarce about the city. Mr. Kennedy will be able to stop the use of the drafts and notes, but the currency is gone, and of its amount he is the poorer to-day.

Quite a Fire. —About 1:30 o'clock this morning a fire commenced in Mr. Tomkins' outbuilding, corner of Earl and Barrie Streets. Before the firemen were called out and arrived at the scene of action the flames spread to the double tenement on Earl Street, owned by Mrs. Carroll, which was entirely destroyed. The back kitchen attached to Mrs. Reynes's house on Barrie Street was burned, but the main building was saved. The sheds in rear of Ald. Gaskin's house on Barrie Street were also consumed; and the roof of a tenement to the yard, (also owned by Ald. Gaskin) was considerably damaged. The fire, it will thus be seen, covered quite a space, and made a great illumination while it lasted. The firemen were promptly on hand and worked hard, but they fought against many disadvantages, one being a want of water. There was not much insurance on the property. Ald. Gaskin's loss is partially covered. Mrs. Carroll has an insurance in the Canada Agricultural Company of \$500; and Mr. Tomkins has a policy for a similar amount on the same company. We cannot say how the fire originated. Mrs. Carroll's houses were unoccupied, and one of Ald. Gaskin's was without a tenant.

A Fast Opinion. —The correspondent of the Mail, who attended the regatta at Brockville in the interest of our Toronto contemporary, undertook to do a little fishing when he made certain comparisons between Kingston and Brockville and wildly asserted that the yarn, so finely spun, only shows what a good young man can do when filled with something besides common sense. Kingston did not bring the Toronto and St. Regis lacrosse players here as a counter attraction to the Brockville regatta; the Celebration Committee had nothing to do with the engagement of these men, whose visit was brought about by Mr. Morrison, President of the Street R. R. Company. Nor was Kingston aiming to outdo the attractions of the Hanlan race, nor did the ubiquitous newspaper man remain away from Br. Skilvick because of any prejudice, but because they had plenty to do at home, much more than the Mail correspondent had to do at Brockville, with all his fuss and flourish.

The Glorious Fourth. —We have no doubt, but that thousands will assemble at Cape Vincent to-morrow to see the amusements incident to the celebration of the Fourth of July. Under ordinary circumstances the programme is sufficient to induce many to go from this city; but on this occasion there will be greater reason to visit our American cousin, because of the presence of the best carmen in Canada and the United States. The early morning boat will deliver its passengers in time for the latter witness the complete programme of sports. The Battery Band will play on the Kingston steamer.
