

SCENES IN ST. LOUIS THE MORGUE AND THE DISPENSARY -- HOW

CASES OF SUNSTROKE ARE TREATED.

The morgue and the dispensary were the two points in the city where activity and industry prevailed. At the former every pipe of the many which hedge the building were as busy as could be in throwing spray in all directions, for the purpose of keeping the air wet and holding gown the odor to which an average of half a dozen bodies comtantly contributed. By 9 o'clock a. m., seven new bodies had been handled and about the same number of those of twenty-four hours' standing had been shipped to their place of deposit in potter's field. All day long, the long, heavy, ugly-looking and oderous pine boxes were being received and shipped, and the work did not close with dark. Every precaution was taken to prevent the ghastly traffic from becoming a nuisance to the neighborhood, and considering the circumstances there was very little complaint.

THE DESPENSARY CORPS labored incessantly yesterday, from early morning, with bacely time to get meals, till after midnight. Health Commissioner Frances, Dr. Garesche, Sergt. McGrew, the two ambalance experts, two officers and two other hands formed the crops. The cases began to arrive about 11 n'clock, and once started, the work of rabbing down with ice-bricks, dousing with foe-water, slapping with shingles, and rubbing with other and cholorform never stopped. There were more serious cases than on previous days, and some of these involved hard work on the part of some one or two men for several hours each. The scene was a most remarkable one, and the five woven-wire cots were almost constantly occupied. The worst cases came in drooping, pulseless and heated to almost a fiery degree, eyes rolling, clothing ruined and consciousness gone. In each of these the first movement was to strip them to the waist, or completely. Then, being placed on their backs, with their heads on rubber pillows, they were put through a course of treatment that, although necessary and effective, was simply terrible. Hage of ice being applied to the head, quart after quart of ice-water was dashed against their feverish bodies, no part escaping the cutting attack. Such an application
