

## Irish Affairs

The Government has announced that the Irish Board of Education will be composed of three Catholics, the three members of the Church of Ireland and one Presbyterian. The Irishmen are satisfied and will pass the bill this week.

Despatches from Dublin and other Irish cities represent that great measure is felt in consequence of the passage of the new Catholic Clergy Bill, and the new Secondary Education Act, as well as the implied promise of the Government to liberate all the remaining Roman Catholics in Ireland. The Sunday Closing Bill was reported by all classes, "to give the local authorities of any place the right to close the closing of all public houses and liquor-shops on a Sabbath Saturday until sunset." Monday, The Education Bill appropriates £1,000,000 of the sum funds of the disestablished church, to be expended at the rate of £25,000 a year, under the supervision of a Board of seven members - three Catholics, three Episcopalian, and one Presbyterian - in payment on the result system to the schools, which enable their pupils to take a certain examination in regular known ledge, and in "extreme" examinations to pupils of extraordinary attainments. The pupils and their teachers are examined in religious creeds, and no interference with the religion of the schools will be permitted. The Catholic hierarchy will all be in favor of the bill, but the Catholic members in Parliament wished that four members of the Board should be Catholics; a point they have now waived. The bill passed the Lords some time ago.
