THE CLOSING RALLY MEETING OF WORKINGMEN Reception of Mr. Jury! A YOUNG TORY BADLY MIXED.

AUGUST OF TO-DAY'S SUCCESS! FACTS AND FIGURES FOR THE ELECTORS.

Last evening the City Hall was filled to overflowing with an audience which expressed the utmost delight with the speech of Mr. Jury, one of the most fluent and eloquent speakers whom we have ever heard.

The chair was occupied by Mr. E. J. B. Pense, President of the Liberal Club, who stated the auspices under which the meeting was called, and that it would have been held earlier but that they could not secure the attendance of Mr. Jury until the present.

Mr. B. M. BRITTON said that the time for speaking had nearly past, and that the time for action had nearly arrived, and that on the morrow they would by their signs on the ballot speak more effectively than he or Mr. Jury could expect to do.

Mr. ROBINSON, M.P.P., addressing the audience as fellow workmen, reminded the audience of a circumstance which occurred five years ago, when Sir John A. Macdonald had brought Mr. D. O'Donoghue from Ottawa to speak in favour of Sir John Macdonald.

Mr. JURY, of Toronto, who was welcomed in a much more cordial manner than Sir John was when he appeared under similar circumstances, and appealed to them for reselection. He thanked them for his reselection, and then proceeded to discuss the 'National Policy,' contending at the outset that the policy was as inoperative in its character as the man who advocated it.

A Committee appointed to investigate them, and to that invitation not a single member of the Opposition had dared to revive the slanders. (Loud cheers.)
