Call the roll in the House of Inquiry and the answer will be Stockbrokers from Broadway, lawyers and merchants from all about. I say I could call names, and I may call names, even if the whole fabric of society should tumble into wreck.

"I prefer that banishment which walls in filth to that which covers up its putrefaction under cash-hair shawls and point-lace, riding in \$5,000 carriages, a liveried driver ahead and a roostered family behind. I tell you what I want to see is the priestess presiding at the lowest world, her bleeding carcass found in her own bath-tub. Nevertheless, for the existence of the haunts of sin men were more to be pitied than to be despised.

"I felt," cried Mr. Talma, appearing to suit the action to the word, "less-half of the burden of malediction from the unpitied head of unfeeling woman. I give it to you as my opinion that the sterner portion of the world will be hereafter compared to the punishment of that man who, turning his back on the woman he has sworn to cherish, goes forth to seek affectional alliances elsewhere. For such a man the portion will be fire, hell, tempest, war, darkness, blood, anguish and despair, forever, forever, forever.

"I wish the preacher hoarsely pursued, 'that there might be police raid, lasting a long time, to go down into the dens of sin and carry these men off, followed by twenty reporters to take the sinners names, and put 'em in full capitals in next day's paper, and I'd like to go along. It is not much that men need to be looked after—their fathers and mothers. But I have come to the conclusion that there are Captains of Police in New York who are in complicity with crime, who get \$10,000 a year for not telling, and who receive a percentage of every bottle of wine that is sold in the haunts of sin on their precinct.

"In the 30th Precinct there are 121 dens of death. Night after night, year after year, they are untouched. Not long ago a masquerade was held in which the men and women who frequent these places took part, and the policemen at the ball, and presented the prizes. It was a chance for an American to get into the stirrup and say, 'Men! follow, a man who shall in one night sweep around, take all the chiefs of these places of iniquity, putting his political aspirations, thoughts of private property, of life, to one side. That man be Mayor of New York—he would be fit to be President."
