If there is a field overrun with that noisance, the daisy turn in your sheep before it is ripe, and that is the end of the pest. Then, their manure is very excellent and well distributed. of them to start with. BORE MANURE. - A Russian chemist gives the following process for the preparation of bones for manure, which, it is said, has received the approbation of Liebig. Mix 400 parts of ground bones with 400 parts of wood askes, containing ten per cent. of carb nate of potash, and add eaxty parts of quicklime. This mixture is placed in a tank or barrel, with water sufficient to make the whole moist. In a short time the bony matter is completely disaggregated by the caustic potash, while the pasty mass formed is then taken from the tank, dried, mixed with an equal amount of mould, and is then ready to be discributed.


