**POLITICAL PORTRAIT.**  
HON. R. J. CARTWRIGHT, M. P.  
(London Advertiser.)  
Mr. Cartwright might be a measure he called an hereditary legislator. His grandfather, the late Richard Cartwright, sat in the first Parliament of Canada, which met at Niagara when the site of this city was a timber wilderness, and continued a member of the Legislative Council until his death in 1815. His uncle, the Hon. John Solomon Cartwright, represented Lennox in the same Assembly for many years, like his father before him, concurrently discharging the duties of law-giver and law-maker, both holding seats on the Bench while members of Parliament. Born to ample means, and thoroughly trained and disciplined, it seemed but natural that young Cartwright should take up the legislative mantle of his ancestors and seek a seat in Parliament of his country with the early history of which the name is intimately interwoven. When considering on the sunny side of life, Mr. Cartwright was returned for Lennox over the late Mr. Augustus Hooper, brother of the present member for that country, and after a profuse expenditure of money, which no doubt secured election could be fought in those good days; his personal character and his talents all combining to forward him in the pursuit of political distinction. He early formed an intimate friendship with Alexander Gait, and after the latter left the Government in 1867 up to the time of his abandoning Parliament in 1872 the two might always when in the House be seen sitting at the same desk in the non-official section of the front row.  
At the outset of his political career Mr. Cartwright devoted much attention to the Militia Question, then a matter of great importance, and he decided directly or indirectly, the fate of more than one Government. But he soon discovered that his talents were bent in the direction of finance, and his speeches in Parliament have since been almost exclusively on subjects connected with what
