

MERCHANTS' UFA Only a week ago an extraordinary decline in the Bank of Montreal stock, of 12 per cent., took place in one day, owing to the reduction of the dividend. Since then the stock has steadily declined, and to-day forced down by the feeling created by the W. Gunn & Co. failure, and the financial troubles in England, it closed at 1491, or 54 per cent. lower than on Tuesday last. It is not thought that the Bank will lose much by the Gunn & Co. failure, the only loss being from depreciation in current shipments of grain, which cannot be extraors dinarily heavy, and, besides, the Liverpool grain market has developed considerable strength during the past two days. But cables have been received from England by brokers here, to sell stocks, and, of course, quite a number of shares of the Bank of Montreal are being put on the market in consequence. The troubles in Britain, more particularly the extraordinary and unexpected demands upon the shareholders of the Glasgow Bank, necessitate such action. The panicky and unsettled feeling in Bank of Montreal stock, which can be traced to direct causes, has about spent itself. The rest of the Bank stocks have not been similarly affected; in fact, Merchanta' Bank on the strength of a rumor that it will pay a 4 per cent. dividend, has advanced this afternoon 11 per cent., clos-
