AROUND BLANCO BAY.

A List of the Useful Plants Which Grow in That Region.

Between many plants we found in the vicinity of Bianco bay I will mention a few which, on account of usefulness, are already, and will be still more, of very great importance. Between these plants the first place belongs to the wild date or datilillo tree (Yucca Scottii), a tall tree, occasionally forty and fifty feet high.

Datilillo looks sometimes like a palmetto, but has narrow long and very sharp leaves. The stem is very fibrous, and excelient from which to prepare paper, cordage, matting, etc. The London Telegraph is printed on the paper manufactured out of the fiber of lever California wild date. It grows in abundance

south of San Quentin and Rosario valleys.

Candlewood tree (fuguiera gigantea), by the Mexicans called cirio, is a very remarkable plant. It presents a very singular appearance in a desert, sometimes growing straight like an arrow, sometimes inclined in all possible positions, or bent in most fantastic forms. The leaves are very small, the bark white and it is covered with long twigs. The stem contains pith, which is eaten by cattle. In the hollow trunks of this remarkable plant swarms of wild bees find their abode. Here I must remark that the bees were unknown before on the peninsula. They came from upper California, and now they are everywhere, honey being used by the Mexicans instead of sugar for tea or coffee. The candlewood tree is also very fibrous and can be used in the same manner as detritilo.

The third remarkable plant is maguey or agave shawii. It belongs to the family of the century plants, and it grows everywhere from San Diego to San Lucas. It forms a beautiful object in the desert, with its dark green leaves and splendid yellow flowers. It has also fibrous qualities; besides, out of this plant is prepared the celebrated Mexican beverage—mescal.

Though the country in the vicinity of Blanco bay is very rich in flora, yet there is a perfect absence of animal life, and a perfect silence reigns there supreme. The only living creature that seems to thrive there is the trap door spider, occasionally though wrongfully called tarantula. This trap door spider, cteniza California, is only half as targa as the tarantula, but belongs to the same family of mygalidæ. It inhabits the underround holes or tubes, provided with very ngeniously constructed trap doors. The tests I found near Blanco bay were about a alf dozen in number, and dug on level round, but as I could see all of these tubes were abandoned. - Cor. San Francisco Chron-

Smartening the Coronation Chair.

More care, it is believed, has been taken than on previous occasions, but one wanton piece of nischief has certainly been committed. Yet this is true. The chair nade 600 years ago to contain the stone which even then had a long story behind it, has suffered much from hard usuage and from the hands of the mischievous. But not even in the perilous time when George IV was crowned was it attempted to take away the chair's age and make a new thing of it. Now, when we pride ourselves on knowing more about old art work than our fathers did, this has been done, and the throne of six and twenty monarchs has been vulgarized into the semblance of the hall chair of a Cockney Gothic villa.-The Athe-






