FRONTENAC CHEESE BOARD. KINGSTON, Aug. 4 .- An interesting meeting of the County of Frontenac cheese board was held this afternoon. The attendance of salesmen was large. The buyers present were Messes. Thompson, Gananoque; Madden, Newburgh; and Miller, Picton. No business was done until nearly 5 o'clock, when the salesmen began to get restless and desired to go home. The buyers, did not offer, as they wanted to hear what the salesmen expected to get for their cheese. There were 1,659 boxes of cheese registered -784 white; 875 coloured. While the salesmen were making up their minds as to the prices they would take Mr. Miller delivered a very able and instructive address on "cheese colouring." His remarks were appreciated. He was the life of the meeting and gallantly made the first offer, 91c. for the cheese boarded. Thompson did better and offered 9ac. Madden, who did not seem anxious to purchase all the cheese offered, began to brighten up and inquired how many farmers would take 10c. for their lots. He was astonished on discovering that cheese could not be bought for that money. The salesmen desired 101c. Madden proposed 10 1-16 for the board; Thompson 10 tc.; and Miller 10 3 16 for choice of selections. The latter buyer wanted the July make of Perth Road, Union, Oregon and Pine Hill. The salesmen representing these factories would not let their goods go. Miller then tried the salesman acting for Bradshaw's factory, offering him 101c. for his cheese. Price refused. Miller purchased 100 boxes coloured at 10 3-16, and 300 boxes at 101c., 175 boxes white, and 135 boxes coloured. No other sales were made.


