



Dainty Little Standing Cabinets That

Are Useful in Any Room. Little standing cupboards, or cabinets, are a novelty described by The Art Interchange as very pretty and convenient. The framework is of cane or bamboo and very light. Plain cloth or felt, and even linen; is fitted into the frame all around, and either embroidered or painted on the front panel. One of white cane has olive green cloth covering, embroidered with a design of snowballs worked in

These little cupboards are about a vard high and sixteen inches wide. In bedrooms they are used as receptacles for shoes and slippers, and are useful and pretty in any

Plants for Winter Flowering.

Summer preparation is necessary to secure nice winter flowering plants. Cyclamens make brilliant winter bloomers. Gradually withhold water from them during the summer. Early in the fall repot in fine, rich soil and water moderately until they start into vigorous growth.

Sow pansy seed for fall blooming plants; shade from the sun with evergreen branches or cotton cloth.

Keep all flower spikes pinched out of young primrose plants intended for flowering next winter. One need not expect plants exhausted by summer flowering to do well in

How Miss Parloa Makes Angel Cake.

For making angel cake Miss Parloa advises the use of a pan that has little legs at the top corners, so that when the pan is turned upside down on the table after baking a current of air will pass under and over it. Her recipe is as follows: The whites of eleven eggs, one and a half cupfuls of granulated sugar, one cupful of pastry flour, measured after being sifted four times; one teaspoonful of cream of tartar, one of vanilla extract. Sift flour and cream of tartar together; beat the white to a stiff froth; beat the sugar into the eggs and add the seasoning and flour, stirring quickly and lightly. Beat until ready to put the mixture into the oven. Do not grease the pan. Bake forty minutes in a moderate oven.

Liquid for Sponging Clothing.

The following is said to answer excellently for removing grease spots and stains from clothing and carpets: Two ounces of white castile soap, two ounces of ammonia, one ounce of glycerine and one ounce of ether; cut the soap fine, dissolve it in one pint of water over the fire; add two quarts of water. This should be mixed with water in proportion to a teacupful to one ordinary sized pail of water. Mix thoroughly and wash soiled garments in it. For removing spots use a sponge or clean flannel cloth, and with a cloth rub as dry as possible. Woolen goods may be made to look bright and fresh by being sponged with this.

A Cooler for Bread and Cake.

Mrs. Lincoln recommends a bread or cake cooler, made of fine wire, set in a narrow frame thirty inches long by twelve or fifteen broad, and it is a very useful article, as it will hold several small loaves. An old wire window screen, too small for modern windows, with cleats on the ends to keep it two or three inches from the table, answers well for this purpose.

A Good Pudding.

A simple, wholesome and very nice fruit | kinds. pudding is made as follows: Pour a quart of boiling water over a cupful of tapioca and let it stand one hour. Lay cut peaches or apples (fresh or canned) upon a buttered dish; add two cupfuls of sugar, a little lemon, vanilla or wine to the tapioca; pour this over the fruit and bake one hour.

To Make Firm Jelly.

Never attempt to make jelly on a cloudy or damp day, if firmness and clearness are desired. If jelly is not very firm let it stand in the sun for a few days, keeping it covered with pieces of window glass or musquito net-


A Novelty in Door Mats.

Door mats made from scrap leather, made into links and strung on metal wires, are a novelty. The appearance of these mats is good, while they are at the same time flexible, durable and afford firm footing.

Double Vegetable Dishes.

The widely extended use of plated tableware throughout the country is due to the excellent work done by the manufacturers. The silver plate ware of today, as made by trustworthy manufacturers, will, much of it, with ordinary care last a lifetime. This fact has come to be generally known among consumers, who are every year becoming more and more aware of the importance of securing the best quality of plate. In this connection it may be well to caution all housewives against buying any plated ware that does not bear the stamp of some well known manufacturer. Avoid all plated ware that bears no stamp at all, for such ware is of inferior make and is dear at any cost.

As there appears to be, on the part of the average buyer, some confusion in regard to the comparative merits of what is termed "nickel silver" and "silver plate on white metal," it may be well to explain that nickel silver exceeds plated white metal in price, is lighter in weight, bears extreme heat better qualities mentioned, it pays to buy the nickel silverware for hotels and other places where it will be subjected to unusual wear and tear. In the ordinary household, however, where economy is an object, nickel silver becomes a useless expense, the best silver plate on white metal being quite equal to ordinary demands. Articles, such as coffee and tea sets, water pitchers, vegetable dishes and the like, last for many years without replating. A fact not generally known to housekeepers, who imagine they must have a nickel silver coffee or teapot to stand on the back or at the side of a stove is, that a white metal pot, if full of water, will not melt. By this is not meant, of course, that a plated pot can be set with impunity on a red hot range, but just what is stated, at one side or on the back of the stove, provided it is filled with water, milk, tea or other liquid.



DOUBLE VEGETABLE DISH.

Silver plated vegetable dishes which are so ornamental to a table are both useful and economical. Although the first cost exceeds that of the usual china dishes, the silver ones are cheapest in the end, as these last a life time. The model in our cut shows what is known as a double dish. By removing the handle on the cover, the latter, turned over, makes a second dish. As will be seen, the body of the dish is in bright finish with a fluted edge, while the cover is ornamented in repousse.




