THE KINGSTON MARKETS.

KINGSTON, Aug. 24. - A grain dealer says: "Nothing is being done at our warehouse just now. We have received a few bags of new barley, of fair quality and weighing about 46 lbs to the bushel, but no prices can be quoted. No, we can give no quotations on any grains. We are looking, however, for better prices for new grain, as the crop is a

Hay is worth from \$9 to \$10 per ton. The receipts here just now are no more than is required for city use, hence the shippers are idle. Mr. Sabre went to Ernesttown to-day to start his presses. He says there was a good fair crop, that the quality, for shipment, is better than has been grown around here for the past five years. Straw will be quite scarce.

Butter is quoted at 25c. to 28c. per lb and is actively enquired for. A Montreal exchange says the value of the exports of Canadian make for the first three months of the season shows an increase over recent years, being \$91,597, but when compared with 1880, when the value reached \$392,084, some idea of the decline in the butter trade may be obtained.

Eggs are active at 13c. to 15c. per dozen. The large quantities sent to the United States keeps the prices up.

The vegetable market is very trisk with prices as follows: Tomatoes, 50c. to 75c. per bush.; corn, 6c. to 10c. per dozen; onions, \$1.25 per bush.; cabbage, 50c. to 75c. per dozen; cauliflowers, 5c. to 15c. each; beets and carrots, 50c. per bush.; potatoes, \$1 to \$1.25 per bag.
