

THE TEMPERANCE CAUSE.

Mr. John Bright on the Suppression of The Liquor Traffic.

TURONTO, Sept. 6 .- John Bright has written the following letter, dated Roch dale, August 23rd, to a gentleman in this city

DEAR SIR, - I suppose all men will admit that it would be a great blessing if the manufacture, sale and use of drinks which intoxicate were abolished, but it is difficult to imagine a state of public opinion in which this could be done. The whole question and its solution must depend on public opinion, which may agree to restrictions which are important, but will for a long time, and perhaps always, refuse the absolute prohibition which I suppose you are contending for. It seems to be with us, and probably with you, that a severe system of taxation is almost the only remedy which can be adopted with much hope of success. By this course we may reduce the number of houses where the drink is sold and thus lessen the temptation, which so many persons seem unable to resist, and at the same time it would add to the cost of the drink and thus to some extent diminish the consumption of what is so great a source of mischief. I fancy you are in advance of us on this question. With us only-moderate. measures have any chance of success, and we must be content to travel more slowly than is the case in some parts of your continent. With you in Canada and with the temperance party in the United States, I hope and wish that the temperance cause may prosper. Very truly yours, John BRIGHT. Press Criticism of Party Misdeeds.
