THE CUROSITY SHOP.

The Battery by Which Certain Electrical Fish Give Shocks.

The apparatus for generating and discharge ing electricity in electrical fish may be described best by taking the torpedo for a subject. The apparatus is composed of a number of perpendicular columns in the shape of eight-sided prisms separated by walls of membrane, containing a fluid freely supplied with blood, and laced with an immense number of nervous filaments, the whole being something like a galvanic pile. In one very large fish 1,200 columns were counted, and 150 plates to the inch. In one specimen of American torpedo it was estimated that there were 300,000 plates, the prisms being about two inches in height and containing 100 plates to the inch. The intervals between the plates are filled with calbuminous fluid, mostly water, but containing salt in solution. That the discharge of this fish is the same as that of common electricity is shown by the fact that it renders the needle magnetic and decomposes chemical compounds, while by it heat is evolved and an electric spark obtained.

A Powerful Erute.

Two travelers have given accounts of the gorilla in the forests of Africa. The first of these was Hanno, a Carthagenian, who commanded an expedition sent to Colonige, Africa, more than twenty-two centuries ago. The second, Paul Du Chaillu, visited Africa about twenty-five years ago. Hanno supposed them to be the veritable savage inhabitants of the country and mentions their great strength. His men captured three females, but they fought so desperately that it was necessary to kill them. Du Chaillu gave many interesting facts concerning the gorilla habits. The beast uses no weapons except those with which nature has provided him. With a single blow of his enormous foot, armed with short curved nails, he will disembowel a man or fracture his skull. There are circumstances recorded where, on finding a gun, the gorilla has bent the barrel between his two hands.

The Supposed Polar Sea.

The existence of an open sea at the north pole is believed in by many distinguished scientific men. Dr. Kane stated that it was reached by one of his exploring parties. There is something to wonder at in a band of men crossing immense fields of ice, with the thermometer 30 to 40 degs, below zero, and suddenly striking a warm sea, with the thermometer 30 to 40 degs, above zero.

This open sea, said to have been discovaered by Dr. Kane's party about seven degrees from the pole, is explained by the discovery of an immense body of warm water in the Pacific ocean which finds its way through Behring strait into the Polar basin, where it mingles with another vast body of warm water incessantly poured into the basin by the Atlantic gulf stream. Two officers of the German Polar expedition of 1870-71 claim to have followed the coast line of the open Polar sea for nearly 500 miles.

Coats of Arms.

Heraldry seems to have had its origin in the necessity of using some device to distinguish persons concealed by their armor while waging battle. From the use of these devices on garments is derived the phrase "coat of arms." There are arms of states, of communities, and of persons and families. The first are those assumed by sovereign princes or by governments as distinguishing badges for their respective kingdoms, empires or states, The second include those of ecclesiastical, lay and municipal corporations. The third are insignia borne by individuals and families, generally by right of inheritance or of grant. All follow the same general heraldic rules, and are displayed on a shield or escutcheon.

Emblematic Flowers.

There has been some dispute recently as to whether any special flower is emblematic of America. The rose stands for England, the thistle for Scotland, the shamrock for Ireland, the lily for France, corn flower for Germany, snow flower for Switzerland, tulip for Holland, cactus for Mexico, maple for Canada, chrysanthemum for Japan: It is claimed by different persons that both the violet and the Mavflower are emblematic of America, but if any particular flower were in common use to represent America there would be no cause for dispute. Certainly there is no doubt about what is represented by the thistle or the shamrock.

What is a Tuft Hunter?

In the English universities all students wear the regular cap and gown which has been prescribed for undergraduates for centuries. The cap, commonly called "mortar board," is a sort of skull cap with a frame of about ten inches square on top, covered with the same material as that of which the cap is made. From the center of this square hangs a tassel. Noblemen are entitled to wear a gold tassel instead of the plain one of the commoner, Certain students who are accused of toadying to their noble fellows are called "tuft hunters," or, in other words, hunters of the gold

The Foundations of Venice.

The city of Venice came to be built with canals instead of streets from the fact of being situated in the midst of lagoons, collectrvely known as the lagoon of Venice, and originally formed by the retreating of the sea. At Venice they are separated from the sea by a tongue of land extending at a distance of about four miles from the coast and divided by gaps, some of which form harbors, and inclose numerous small islands, into which piles are driven for the construction of the city.

Heads and Tails.

Every coin has an obverse and reverse side, but every coin has not a head side and a tail side. If the obverse of a coin is taken for the head (and that is the side the head is usually on), then the side containing the principal in scription or figure may be considered the head, no matter what its shape. The date is usually on the obverse or head side of a piece in the exergue. The general rule in case of doubt is to take the date side for the head. unless the date is in the middle of the piece in large figures.




