



A VERY ROMANTIC STORY

How a Halifax Woman Lost Both Her Husband and Her Home,

Halifax, N. S., Oct. 12. Some time ago Henry James was arrested for brutally illtreating the children of a widow named Mrs. Miller and setting fire to her house. James pleaded guilty and was committed for trial. A few weeks later the banns for a marriage between Henry James and Mrs. Miller were called in St Lake's cathedral. In due time Rev. F. R. Murray called at the gaol. Mrs. Miller, whose children had been cruelly beaten and whose house had been burned by James, was the bride. James, the incendiary, was the groom. Mrs. Miller was the only witnesss of importance against her new husband, and, as a woman is not compelled to give evidence against her husband, he stood a good chance of escaping the penitentiary. Everything proceeded swimmingly until the case was called for trial, when James startled his new wife and lawyers by insisting upon pleading guilty. The deluded woman is passionately attached to her criminal husband.
