Descriptions of the Interesting Exhibit and

Sports Held at Napance and D. Ita. The rain spoiled the number of entries at the Napanee fair held last, week. Enough entries had been made to pack the palace but they didn't materialize. The competition was keen. Up stairs, in the north end of the palace, was utilized as the ladies' department and here were .shown many beautiful samples of fancy work. Conspicuous was a silk and plush quilt, exquisitively worked, a large stork in arasene work occupying the centre, while a swan and other designs were worked in other parts of the quilt. Mrs. Caldwell deservedly received first prize on this article. The quilt is valued at \$150.

Down stairs there was much to attract attention. A large exhibit of organs, occupied a central position. The north wing was given up to mammoth vegetables. The potatoes exhibited were first class.

The east wing on the north side was occupied by harness. The south side of the east wing was filled with dairy products and bread, cheese, honey, etc. The display of

bread was the best seen. The competition among the stock was keen, numbers of the prize winners at Belleville and Kingston having to forego honors. As usual the contests between horses was the main attraction. About a dozen really good horses were shown on the track, those driven by W. G. Hogle, J. B. Blanchard, W. Miller and Charles Hawley being the winners, Dr. Ward's stylish black mare and the big mare driven by Richard Wright were prenounced to be good horses by competent judges. W. T. Gibbard's blacks are beautifully matched and a very stylish team. When W. Miller took first prize, Mayor Carson of Kingston, sent him the third prize ticket from the judge's stand and he drove off very much crestfallen; shortly afterward he was handed the red ticket and the joke explained. He joined in the hearty laugh and was in high good humor for the rest of

The judges had considerable sport during the trotting race. The Milling horse took first and "Plucky Fred" and the Hulett mare were ordered to try again for 'second place. The driver of the Milling horse was put behind the Hulett mare and with the change won easily, "Plucky Fred" running nearly all the way. Mr. Goodwin protested against the change of drivers and also against the driver yelling so as to break up "Fred." Goodwin said he didn't know whether it was a white man or an Indian that was after him.

Mr. John Johnston and Miss Johnston, of Wilton, seated in a splendid open pheaton, captured the red ticket for the best turnout, much to the disgust of Wm. Miller and Miss Ella Daly. The judges said that Miss Daly should have had a younger man with her.

#### The Fair at Delta.

The South Leeds agricultural show, held at Delta on Tuesday and Wednesday of last week, was a financial success. On the second day there was a large attendance. In the main building there was a fair display of manufactures, including drain-tile, tinware, furniture, harness, etc. Of the latter there was a particularly fine display, which was nicely arranged. Of course in cheese and butter the entries were full and the articles of excellent quality. Many contemplated the beautiful in nature as embodied in the display of flowering plants and shrubs. In the second flat were displayed articles of domestic manufacture, and these constituted one of the finest and most creditable features of the fair. Woolen goods of every description made up an exhibit on which any section of Ontario might be proud. The arts and ladies' work were nicely arranged in a building devoted entirely to these classes. Their beauty and merit were such that the building was thronged all day with sightseers. In cattle there was a fair exhibit. There was a small show of swine, but it included some fine Berkshires. The speeding in the ring was interesting, and the result of each heat was anxiously awaited by a numerous assembly of sporting men. The track was not firm enough for a fast pace, and being so narrow it enabled the drivers to do a little jockey ing. But Bell Wilson at length broke the combination, much to the satisfaction of onlookers. There was to have been a lacrosse match in the afternoon, between Farmersville and Delta clubs, but Farmersville was not fully advised of the decision of the directors of the fair until too late to get the team together. Jimmy White, from the North Shore, introduced a little variation into the free-for-all race. He drove on the track in a heavy gig, and collided with Warrior. The racing sulky and the gig came together with a crash, breaking a wheel off each venicle, and sending the drivers rolling in the dust.

#### TO BE WELL OPPOSED.

The Temperance People Preparing for the Coming Struggle in Renfrew.

The petitions for the repeal of the Scott act in Renfrew county were filed at the sheriff's office, Pembroke, on Thursday. The number of signatures is calculated at 2,604. The petitions were some time in circulation. The temperance people, three years ago, when the total vote was only two-thirds what it is now, secured 2,068 signatures in three we ks. The Renfrew Mercury, an enthusiastic Scott act sheet, says that the temperance people have decided to raise \$1,000 by subscription, as an "anti-repeal fund," half to be paid at time of subscrip tion and the remainder upon call, when needed. A good portion of this amount is already subscribed. Part of this fund will be devoted to doing what the alliance considers that they ought not, but the government ought, to do, enforcing the Scott act by the employment of special officers. It was decided to hold public meetings throughout the county before the vote, and committees were appointed to make the necessary arrangements. A monthly county paper is to be established and published regularly. A resolution was passed reiterating the expression of the resolution passed at the annual meeting in Renfrew, condemning the government and officials for entering third offences as second and first offences.






