THE NOTTINGHAM CONGRESS-

Working Men Flocking in by Thousands From Neighboring Towns.

Loxbox, Oct. 18 .- The Nottingham congress, which meets to-day, will be the most representative gathering the liberal party has ever held. The enthusiasm in Nottingham and neighborhood is extraordinary. Working men are flocking in by thousands from neighboring towns. There are fears of a gigantic crush. Mr. Gladstone is in fine voice and form. He daily chops down trees in Hawarden park in his shirt sleeves with his hat off. He has been powerfully impressed by the descriptions of the state of Ireland he has received from liberal members who have been making a tour in that country. The congress will affirm the steady and rapid growth of the policy of concilliating the people of Ireland by granting them a legislative body for managing their own affairs; will look with confidence to an early settlement of the Irish question on Mr. Gladstone's principles; will strongly condemn coercive laws, depriving Ireland of her constitutional rights; will record its emphatic protest against the action of the executive in leaving the people of Ireland to the mercy of an indiscriminate and undirected force in practicing the old tyrannical tary principles in respect to the right of public meetings, a free press, free speech and free combination. Regarding general politics it will declare in favor of a franchise based on Mr. John Morley's principle of "one man, one vote," that is the abolition of plural voting; also for a reform of the disestablishment an immediate place in the liberal programme ; also in favor of a great reform or the land laws, allotments for laborers, county government, local option, a London municipal government, and free edu-

### THE BOODLEISM OF FRANCE.

Men in High Office Accused of Crookedness-A Misuse of Public Money.

Paris, Oct. 18. - Le Paris accuses M. Wilson, President Grevy's son-in-law, of using pressure to obtain the repayment to Messrs. Dreyfus, the bankers, of 150,000 francs, the amount of duty exacted by the courts in the famous Peruvian guano case, The paper says that Sadi Clernot, who was then finance minister, refused to refund the money, when M. Grevy's assistance was sought, he having defended the Messrs. Dreyfus and received 200,000 francs as fees. Sadi Clernot was driven from office and M. Dauphin, his successor, proved more pliable, although M. Bredif, the head of the finance department, strongly opposed such tampering with the public moneys. M. Wilson, in an interview yesterday, asserted that the department approved the repayment of the money for various substantial reasons.






