Knowing that his wife presides in his simple dwelling, and while she seeks to aid him by affectionate care and judicious economy his labors must provide the means for their support, how could this thought fail to give impetus to every exertion?

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Is any one inclined to call this sentimental romancing? We pity those who, having passed through the experiences of youth and middle age, or beyond the forenoon years, are not ready to accept this as sober truth.

In every position in life an early marriage that enables two faithful hearts to become the united architects of a home is a blessing that seems not to be fully understood.

The advice to wait until one has time and opportunity to know something of life so as to judge with prudence, putting all romantic notions out of the mind, too often proves a fearful temptation to evil and wrong-doing.

Begin your life's work together. That is the true way, and all the sweeter and happier if you begin small. The less style there is the less of real wealth there is, the more time and the more need there will be to become fully acquainted with each other's complete character, and a better opportunity to learn how to bear and forbear, to adjust to tone down or modify such peculiarities as are in danger of disturbing mutual confidence and amiability.

A FORGOTTEN BOOK.

Noah Webster's Translation of the New Testament—Some of the Changes.

Many of the younger members of the honorable guild of bookmen—both readers and writers—will doubtless regard it as quite a startling piece of literary intelligence to be told that Dr. Noah Webster, whose spelling book, half a century ago, carried so much light and language into our public schools, and whose unabridged dictionary at a later period rendered him so famous that the world often insisted upon laying the mantle of the "godlike Daniel" upon his shoulders, was the author of a corrected, amended and expanded edition of the Scriptures, the New Testament of which was lettered on the back, "Webster's Testament."

In a ten page introduction Dr. Webster states and explains the alterations made by him. A few of the changes are noted, as follows: "Take no thought" becomes "Be not anxious."

The emended Bible—an octavo of 500 pages, printed by Hezekiah Howe & Co. and published by Durrie & Peck, New Haven—appeared in 1833. Webster boldly set his name upon the title page as follows: "With amendments of the language by Noah Webster, LL.D."
