Reviving Persons Apparently Dead.

At a meeting of the last congress of German scientists this subject was discussed, and Dr. H. Frank mentioned that there are but two ways to stimulate the heart—electricity and mechanical compression of the heart.

He flexes the hands on the wrist to an obtuse angle, places them both near each other in the ilio-caval region, and makes vigorous strokes in the direction of the heart and of the diaphragm.

Dr. F. has seen life return in fourteen cases, among whom were such as had hung themselves, drowned and asphyxiated by carbonic oxide, and in one case by croup. In three cases of asphyxia by coal gas and in one case of apparent death by chloroform the method described alone succeeded.
