

RAILROAD MEN ON STRIKE.

Over 1,000 Menjon the Reading Quit Work ... The Causes of the Trouble.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 23:-Over 1,000 men on the Philadelphia and Reading railroad, train men, coal handlers, and freight handlers, quit work this afternoon. This action was caused by the introduction of a train crew of live non union men to do the work from which union men had been discharged. This movement will be communicated to all the employees of the road, and a general strike may be the result. The men in the employ of Charles M. Taylor's Sons refused to deliver freight unless the non-union laborers were discharged. The news of the refusal was telegraphed to the general offices. of the company: Superintendent Sweizard issued an order discharging the crew who had refused to handle the freight, and threatening the same punishment to others who followed the precedent. The remaining four crews, refusing to obey the order, were discharged.

The news quickly spread in Port Richmond and the stevedores, 600, dropped work. A committee of the knights of labour to which the strikers belonged called upon General Manager McLeod and Superintendent Sweizard with the purpose of settling the difficulty. The object was unsuccessful, as the officers would not listen to any ex-

The situation was unchanged this morning. The company made preparations to secure crews, but was unsccessful until 1 o'clock when aid was secured by forming a mixed crew. The engine, manned by the obnoxious crew, proceeded at once to move the freight. The news was communicated. among the other men at work and a concerted action of quitting was speedily agreed upon. An hour was given to allow the employees on the road from West Falls to the river to learn of the determination, and at 4:30 o'clock every man stopped work. Shift. ing engines ran to their usual resting place until the whole number (14) was in one line, and the crews drew the fire and blew out boilers. Men that were wheeling coal dropped their barrow handles, switchmen closed their switches and left the main line open. Conductors, brakemen and others left their work and went to their homes,

ELIZABETHFORT, N.J., Dec. 24. The Reading railroad coal handlers refused to day to load a Cross Creek Lehigh coal company's vessel at Elizabethport docks. They were all laid off. Shipping is entirely suspended. A general "tie-up" is the talk ASHLAND, Pa., Dec. 23. -The miners of Riley & Co.'s Logan colliery struck this morning, throwing over 500 men and boys out of employment.
