THE NEWS FROM EUROPE.

NO PROBABILITY OF WAR BEFORE NEXT SUMMER.

The sentence of Mr. Wilfred Hunt con-

demned—The Imperial Parliament—The

Crown Prince—British Imports and

Exports—The Victoria Jubilee Fund.

LONDON, Jan. 7.—The sentence of two

months' imprisonment in the case of Sir

Wilfred Hunt, who had been arrested and

convicted on a charge of violating the Crimes

Act, by addressing a meeting at Woodford,

Ireland, was confirmed in appeal today.

Judge Heen, before whom the appeal was

heard, declared that although Mr. Hunt had

not acted wisely, he had shown no cowardice.

Immediately after the decision in Mr.

Hunt's case he was conveyed to the jail. He

was followed by a large crowd, whom the

police attempted to disperse by a ruse. This
