COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

THE CHEESE MARKET.

UTICA, Jan. 14 -About these times the cheese market approaches its winter climax-Stocks are held closely, and a concert of action among them generally results in making the market strong. If the stock of cheese proves larger than is likely to be consumed somebody begins to unload below the market When such a movement gets started it becomes infectious, and the desire to get out before new cheese comes into the market spreads. Take last year for in-

In the year before 1886, it was 109,909 boxes, or an average of 6,465 boxes per week during the four months. Allowing that it was the same last year, although the receipts were 108,071 boxes larger during the same period of 1886, the stock on hand May 1st, 1887, must have been 76,597 boxes. Now if we allow about the same figures for receipts and exports this year, from Jan. lst to May 1st, we shall start with an excess of stock on hand in New York on Jan 1st amounting to 30,000 boxes. Unless the receipts this year are smaller and the ex ports larger these figures are not far out of the way, and the probability is that both will be larger.

THE NEWS OF THE WORLD.

FRANCE AND ITALY.

Was like Message From 32, Flourens to the Italian Premier-The Church en the League... The Ten lalgar-square Etots Trinis- Mr. Binlib ur's Perits.

LONDON, Jan 18. -- Commercial and financia business was depressed in Paris to-day, and the Bourse swas heavy on account of the strained relations with Italy. The evening papers attack Italy violently, and La France refers to Premier Crispi as "Bismarck's valet." Instructions have been given to the French consul at Florence as regards the course las should pursue in case the incident is

It is semi-officially announced that Count de Mony, the French Ambassador at Rome, having informed M. Flourens that the Proctor. of Florence had intimated his intention to remove on Friday the scals affixed by the French Consulate to the documents relating to the Hussem successor, M. Flourens has requested Count de Mony to inform Signor Crispi that if such an act of violence is committed the French Government will hold Italy respon-

The Paris urges the Government to demand complete satisfaction from Italy for the indignity offered to the French Consulate at Florence, and, in the event of a failure by Stock on hand, New York, Jan. 1, 1887. ... 122,608 Italy to comply, to sever the relations between Receipts at New York, from Jan. 1 to France and Italy and expel all Italians from

M. Flourens, the French Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Count Menetera, the Italian Ambassador, had a triendly interview this evening. An early settlement of the dispute over the Florence incident is now certain.

A London despatch to The New York Tribune says that official anxiety about Mr. Baltour has greatly increased. If the police authorities are to be believed be is in greater dancer of assassination than Mr. Fuster ever was, whose 'repeated escapes were almost miraculous. Plot after plot to murder the Chief Secretary has been frustrated. The Vice Hegal Lodge, where he resides, and Phoenix Park, in which the lodge stands, are swarming with detectives who do not allow him to take a step alone.

The view taken by the primate of the Church of Ireland that Prof Galbraith's position as a member of the Finance Commattee of the church is incompatible with his membership of the National League, has been sustained by the conference of the church now in session in Dublin. Prot. Galoraith will, he says, . etire from the church committee.

Father Matthew Ryan was released to-day, after serving one month in Limerick Jail for inciting the people to illegal action in connection with the plan of campaign. He was met by 10,000 persons and received with loud cheers and congratulations from the Mayor, Sheriff, Municipal Council and many clergy-

The crowd escorted Father Ryan fourteen miles to his parish at Herbertstown. The police followed the whole distance but were delayed when half way to Herbertstown by a car which had been drawn across the road. Father Ryan was thus enabled on his arrival home to address the people without interfer-He advised the tenants to adopt the plan of campaign, which he said was moral | and Paris. The issue was entirely covered and just, notwithstanding everything that lords, both spiritual and temporal, said to the contrary. A Nationalist meeting announced to be held at Ballygawley, County Tyrone, tomorrow has been proclaimed.

The trial of Cunningham Graham, M.P. for Lanarkshire, and M. Burns, the Socialist leader, charged with participation in the Trafalgar-square riots on Nov. 13, was con cluded to-day. The charges of rioting and assault were laid aside, but they were sentenced to six weeks' imprisonment for taking part in an unlawful assembly.

In the Rouen Cathedral to-day a priest personated God in a dialog with the Devil. The congregation becoming furious, hissed and sang the "Marseillaise" and "En revenant de la revue," and the police had to be called to quell the disorder. Several arrests were made, but an attempt to clear the cathedral was unsuccessful.

The Landwehr clauses of the Military Bill were disposed of in the committee of the Reichstag to-day, and an amendment was also adopted relating to the period of service, the effect of which will be to enable men who enter the active army before their twentieth year to leave the Landwehr earlier. The measure will give the army in time of war nearly 700,000 additional trained men. The bill received the approval of the committee without further amendment. The cost is estimated at between 80,000,000 and 100,000,-000 marks.

The Russian Government has renewed its anti-German measures in the Baltic provinces. Forty Lutheran clergymen in Livonia have been deprived of their benefices without a moment's notice because they used only the German language. The Czar revives the post of Governor of the Three Provinces and holds that official specially responsible for Russiantzing measures. The Polish Circle in Vienna has received an

accession of strength in the persons of the exiled nobles hitherto residing in France and Italy. They have learned from Warsaw that secretly printed proclamations, unanthorized by the Polish Nationalists, bearing the arms of Poland and Austria, are being circulated in Warsaw. These proclamations call upon the Poles to rise in view of the impending war. The directors of Polish journals in Galicia held a conference in Lemberg and decided to maintain the greatest reserve and to warn Russian Poles against the men who are trying to incite a rising.

There is a ministerial crisis in the Admiralty Department. Lord George Hamilton and the civilian members of the board are in antagonism. The First Lord is pledged to effect further financial reform, and to overcome mternal resistance has made the reorganization of the department a Cabinet question. A committee of the Cabinet has been formed to investigate the question under the presidency of Mr. Goschen. This matter has caused consternation in naval circles.

The great success of the issue of Alcoma bonds is generally admitted in the press today. The result has far exceeded the sanguine expectations of the brokers. Is is certain, however, that complaints will be heard from disappointed applicants. The scrip is quoted at 14 premium.

The issue by the Credit Lyonnais of the Quebec Provincial four per cent. loan has also been a success. The applications covered the amount asked in London alone before 12 o'clock to-day, and 11 premium has been obsuned.


