IRISH AFFAIRS CONTINUE TO CALL THE ATTENTION OF PARLIAMENT.

Blard Labor-Cheaper Cable Rates in Prospect-France and the Mexican Trade-French Deserters Shot.

authoritatively made that the first Government business in Parliament will be the reform of procedure, English politics continue to be mainly Irish politics. The statements of the prison doctor that Mr. McLane, M.P., has become a subject of delusions, owing to the severity of his treatment in prison and insufficient food, have made a profound impression. Yesterday's sentences were the heaviest yet passed.

Rev. Father McFadden and Alexander Blane were taken from Londonderry Jail to Dunfanaghy, County Donegal, where they will be tried. On their arrival at Dunfan: aghy, 1000 peasants, armed with sticks, gathered on the billsides in military order. The military prevented the crowd from entering the town.

Earl Grey will soon publish a book describing his experiences in English and Irish polities. He says that the Union was successful until 1868, but Ireland has been used for party ends since that time.

The appeals of twenty-one tenants on Col. Tottenham's estate at Wexford, against sentences for violation of the Crimes Act, have been dismissed by the court.

Four months' imprisonment with hard labor was the sentence imposed on Joseph R. Cox, M.P., convicted yesterday in Dublin on the charge of addressing proclaimed branches of the National League.

Commenting upon the recent arrests of Irish M.P.'s, The North German Gazette of Berlin says that such prompt and vigorous action well befits a Government which is conscious of its duty.

Herbert Gladstone has sent a letter of regret to Lord Clanricarde, saying that when he applied most offensive epithets to His Lordship, in his Leeds speech, concerning the evictions on the Clauricarde estates, he was prompted by strong feelings.

Bismarck is still suffering from rheumatic pains, but it will not prevent him from speak. ing in the Reichstag to-morrow.

Tonquin advices say that eighteen French soldiers were recently shot at one time for desertion.

Yesterday Lord Durham obtained a summons against the owner of Bat, a society newspaper, for libel. The paper had stated when Lord Durham failed to get a divorce from his wife on the ground that she was insane, that Lord Durham's brutality had driven her mad.

Three hundred American pilgrims were received by the Pope on Saturday. The Archbishop of Philadelph, the Bishops of Buffalo, the Vicar-General of Charleston and the Rector of the American College at Rome were among the number.

A conference of the cable companies has been called by John Pender, chairman of the District Cable Company, for the purpose of fixing upon a tariff on a basis of 1 shilling per

In the French Chamber of Deputies yesterday, during the debate on the treaty of commerce between France and Mexico, M. Flourens, Minister of Foreign Affairs, said that France should preserve her markets in Mexico, which the United States were trying to take away from her. The Chamber adopted the treaty.

In a speech at Rathkeale to-day, Michae Davitt advised Lord Guillamore's tenants to refuse the offer tendered them to purchase their hordings, on account of the heavy burdens surely to accrue under present circumstances, and also because Lord Guillamore had evicted two of his tenants. He considered persons who took the farms of evicted tenants cowardly, slimy renegades and lepers.

The officers of the garrison in Philippopolis gave a grand ball last night in honor of Prince Ferdinand and his mother, Princess Clementine. At the close of the festivities Prince Ferdinand was borne to his carriage on the shoulders of his followers amid the acclamations of the assembled throngs. Prince Ferdinand has appointed Princess Clementine chief of a Philippopolis regiment, and the Princess has presented her new command with

a mift of £1200. The Joint Stock Association invite applications for the unsubscribed remainder of three hundred six per cent. first mortgage deventures, £100 each, of the Winnipeg Waterworks

Company, issued at par. The news of the fusion of the Grand Trunk, Northern and Hamilton and Northwestern Railways have been received favorably in the

markets here.

The stock markets have not shown much activity this week. Canadian stocks were generally tirm. Canada four per cents, and Manitoba and Quebec five per cents, were one higher. Among the railways Trunks were flat, second preference 11 lower, first preference a lower. Hamilton and Northwestern bonds have risen one and Northern 1. No changes of importance in miscellaneous shares.

The Financial News publishes a cable from New York stating that the cable war will be settled almost immediately, confirming my statement of a fortnight ago.

The Counties Adopting the Scott Act Should Pay For It.

Berlin, Jan. 27.-The Waterloo County Council, now in session here, passed by a unanimous vote a memorial protesting against the Ontario Legislature voting public money in aid of the enforcement of the Scott Act, which, the Council holds, should be enforced entirely at the expense of the counties adopting it, and not at all at the expense of the counties under the license law.

The Fisheries Commission. WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—The fisheries negotiators, who have held daily sessions at the State Department during the past week, adjourned yesterday until Monday at 2 o'clock. It is understood that they are nearing the end of their deliberations.


