And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissions ers or the majority of them shall and they are hereby authorised from time to time to appoint and employ clerks or other necessary officers for the execution of this act, which said clerks or other officers respecwhich said clerks of other officers respec-tively are hereby required faithfully to exe-cute and perform the trust in them respec-tively reposed, without taking any thing for such their service other than such fees, salaries or rewards as the said commissioners or
