London, July 21. INTENDED COLONY AT THE CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

COFFICIAL CIRCULAR. Downing street, London, 1819.

I have to acquaint you, in reply to your letter of the —, that the following are the conditions upon which it is proposed to give encouragement to emigration to the

Cape of Good Hope. The sufferings to which many individuals have been exposed, who have emigrated to his Majesty's foreign possessions, unconnected, and unprovided with any capital. nected, and unprovided with any capital, or even the means of support, having been very afflicting to themselves, and equally burdensome to the colonies to which they burdensome to the colonies to which they have proceeded, the government have determined to confine the application of the money recently voted, by address in the House of Commons, to those persons who, possessing the means, will engage to carry out, at the least, ten able bodied individuals above 18 years of age, with or more to approach and the means of the more to approach the multiple the

most eligible.

In order to give some security to the government, that the persons undertaking to make these establishments have the Grand Cross of the Order of Charles III. to make these establishments have the means of doing so, every person engaged to take out the abovementioned number of persons or families, shall deposit at the rate of 10l. (to be repaid as hereinafter mentioned) for every family so taken out, provided that the family does not consist of more than one man, one woman, and two children under 14 years of age. All children above the number of two, will be to be paid for, in addition to the deposit abovementioned, in the proportion of 5l. for every two children under 14 years of age, and 5l for every person between the Morillo.
