AT the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace holden at the Town of Kingston in and for the Midland District, on the 11th Oct. 1831.

"It was ordered that in all cases in which claims are made for compensation for Lands taken for Roads, there is an established Commission for such compensation shall appear on the first day of the Session, to support their claim, on its being reported by the Surveyor of Highways according to Law, and in order that the Court may know who are the parties to support any road so confirmed, where a compensation is claimed.
