DOMESTIC.

CHAP. VII. An Act to declare what Fees shall be received by Justices of the Peace for the duties therein mentioned. [Passed 17, February 1827.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that the fees to be taken by Justices of the Peace for the services hereinafter mentioned should be ascertained and authorized by law. Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intitled "an act to repeal, certain parts of an act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intitled, 'an act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'" and by the authority of the same. That from and after the first day of November next, the following fees, and no more, shall be taken from the parties prosecuting, by Justices of the Peace in this Province, or by their clerks, for the duties and services hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

For every Subpoena to a witness, six pence. For every conviction under a penal Statute, seven shillings and six pence. For every warrant to levy a penalty, two shillings and six pence. For making up every Record of conviction when the same is required to be returned to the Sessions or on Certiorari, ten shillings.
