

MIDLAND DISTRICT ACCOUNTS.

To the Magistrates of the Midland District in General Quarter Sessions assembled.

The Committee appointed to examine the accounts of the District for last year, beg leave to report, that they have examined the accounts and vouchers submitted by the Treasurer and have audited various claims for compensation of services rendered since the Sessions of April, 1826.

The claims exhibited by the Members of Assembly for wages during the last Session, amount to £267 which we expect of course to be provided for in the usual manner.

The claims for general services rendered the District amount as per schedule herewith annexed to £346 16 8 which your committee recommend for payment.

The general account current of the Treasurer exhibits a balance in favour of the District actually in his hands of - £580 0 10

The balances due from various Collectors up to this date, exclusive of that of 1819, amount - - - 1477 15 7 1/2

Subject to a deduction of Collectors and Assessors fees up to this period, say - - - 174 3 11 1/2

Then will be this sum of - £1883 12 6 1/2 applicable to the use of the District, and we have reason to expect that the greater portion of this will be available in the course of the present year; from this sum of - - - 1883 12 6 1/2

is to be deducted the amount of claims now admitted and allowance to Sheriff, - - - 446 16 8

deduct a quarters salary for Mr. Dulmage, omitted, - - - 25 0 0

This balance of £1441 15 10 1/2 when all collected, will be liable for the payment of the loans negotiated by the committee for building the Gaol and Court house, to be paid yearly until the whole is paid up, as well for sundry other contingencies.

Your committee do not observe that any steps have yet been taken towards the recovery of arrears due for the year 1819, agreeable to the recommendation of the committee of former years.

Your committee beg leave to remark, that the sum of £126 6 6 1/2 received for road Tax, is now in the hands of the Treasurer, which they recommend to be applied without delay, agreeable to the Statute.

Your committee cannot but regret to state, that they are unable to render a correct statement of the cost of the Gaol and Court house, but documents produced exhibit payments for that object to the amount of £6528 13 2.

A petition has been presented to your committee, by Frederick Keeler, praying for an allowance towards building a bridge over the Salmon River, in the Indian woods, which your committee do not feel themselves authorized by the Statutes to recommend. A petition from the Inhabitants of the townships of Ameliasburgh and Hillier for a like allowance, for work done, is also presented, but your committee for the same reasons decline bringing it under your notice.

Accompanying this report, is a petition presented by Elias Dulmage, praying for an increase of salary as Gaoler, which your committee considering the present state of the District funds, beg to refer to the consideration of the bench.

A general return of the amount of the Assessment lists of the Midland District, is herewith annexed by your committee. All which is submitted.

NOTICE is hereby given to all proprietors of steam-vessels willing to furnish Transport for the service of the Government, during the present season, for the conveyance of troops, baggage, clothing, stores, &c. from Prescott's Kingston, to York, Burlington, and Fort George, on Lake Ontario, and to Queenston, in the Niagara River: and vice versa, that Tenders will be received at this Office until Thursday the 31st instant, at noon.

WOODEN BRIDGE

across the great river Catarqui, from this town to the opposite side. The extreme width of the river, at the proposed site, is 1,600 feet, the greatest depth of water about 15 feet, gradually decreasing to three and two feet, and the bottom is a regular flat lime stone rock, covered with only a small portion of mud.

The Bridge intended to be built, is to be thirty feet in width, with a Draw Bridge, and a foot path of eight feet in the centre, protected by posts and rails, with a Toll House and gates, either on, or at one extremity, and the lowest part of the flooring to be six feet above the high water line. The Bridge is to be supported on wooden piers, (and not to be covered,) and of sufficient strength to allow of the transport of artillery, and as stability, durability, and economy, are primary objects, ornament is not to be taken in consideration.

A plan and specification of the intended Bridge is to be seen at this Office; but should any Plan or Model be given in by those willing to contract with an estimate of the expense which may be approved of by the Board of Directors, such plan may be adopted by them, if thought necessary. Sufficient sureties will be required, and their names to be stated in the Tenders given in.
