WHEREAS, it is expedient to make further provision for regulating the practice of the several District Courts in this

always, That it it shall appear to the Judge who tries the cause that such question is raised unexpectedly in consequence of either party insisting upon matters not set forth in the pleading which the other party could not reasonably have forseen, it shall be in the discretion of the Judge to discharge the jury merely without ordering a nonsuit in which case the Court may in its discretion in Tarm time on heing moved.
