THE DISTRICT COURT BILL.

WHEREAS, it is expedient to make further provision for regulating the practice of the several District Courts in this Province, Be it therefore enacted that a certain act passed in the second year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, "an act to reduce into one act the several Laws now in force, establishing District Courts, and Regulating the practice thereof; and also to extend the powers of the said District Courts" except the 1st, 2d and 3d clauses thereof, and the same is hereby repealed.
