AN account of a marvellous stenographic machine, invented by a young Italian of the name of Gali, now in England, is published in the London and provincial papers.—The following is an account of its properties: "One of its objects is to enable us to write faster than any system of short-hand hitherto known, or any orator can speak. But this is not all. Many copies of a discourse, legibly written, may be taken at the same time while it is spoken. It is played upon by the fingers, like a musical instrument, and the manuscript is rolled off a cylinder during the course of the writing. By employing it, a book may be copied while the reader is perusing it and as fast as it can be read. The judge on the bench may by its means, take down the deposition of witnesses while his mind is intent upon the bearings of evidence. By a little habit even the blind may be made to use an instrument which will enable them to copy faster than any short-hand writer. This ingenious machine has many other advantages, which, if realized according to its inventor's expectations, will produce great changes in our present system of written or telegraphic communication."

ELLISTON, the celebrated comedian, died in London on the 9th July last, aged 63 years. He had been in ill health many months, although he had acted a short time prior to his death. Elliston was an admirable actor, and of very diversified powers. The Atlas says, "In the line more peculiarly his own, he has not left behind him any actor of equal ability." The history of Elliston, whether as an actor or a manager, is so well known, that it is unnecessary to expatiate on his merits.
