into the Treasury under this head—the
amount paid into the hands of the Magistrates of the several townships for disbursement within each townships the several
sums still in the hands of the Treasurer, at
the credit of the townships of the District;
subject to the appropriation of the Magistrates in special sessions, within their respective townships or divisions; and the sum, if
any that may be due the District; from the
Sheriff for Road Taxes collected by the sale
of Lands.

REPORT.

The Committee appointed by the annexed order of Sessions, dated July, 1831, to examine and report relative to the erroneous sale of Land for Assessed Rates by the Sheriff in the years 1830 and 1831, also to examine and Report the Total Amount of Highway Assessments received by the Treasurer under this head, the amount paid into the hands of the Magistrates of the several Townships or divisions for disbursement, and the sums still in the Treasurer's hands, with the sum that may be due the District from the Sheriff's Accounts of sales of lands sold for assessed Rates, the Committee proceeded to the investigation of the claims of sundry persons who had purchased and paid for Lands that were erroneously sold.

It appears that 22 lots of Land containing

It appears that 22 lots of Land containing 3976 acres have been erroneously sold, and the sum of £65 15s. received for the same, the Committee being satisfied that the said claims are just, recommend that the Treasurer be authorized to repay the same, to the persons named in the accompanying list, marked, (Claims,) the list contains the Lots, concessions and acres so sold in each Township.

In order to complete a report on the Sheriff's Accounts of Lands sold for assessed Rates, the Committee commenced their examination with the original lists from which the writs of advertisement were made out, and find the lands offered for sale in 1830 amounted to £3595 4s. 3½d., and the land offered for sale in 1831, amounted to £590 0 11d. making together £4185 5s. 2½d. As the Sheriff had not passed his account with the Treasurer for the Lands sold in 1830, the Committee have taken the accounts for both sales in the following order, by which it will appear the Sheriff has received for the lands sold in 1830, £2856 8s. 1½d., and for the lands sold in 1830, £2856 8s. 1½d. and on examining the both sales there appears land sold to the amount of £47 3s. 1d. which the Sheriff will either account for, or return the said lands to the Treasurer's list, to be re-sold. The land in question is marked in the accounts "unsettled."

The amount of £265 Ss. 10d. appears to have been paid to the Treasurer, between the time of advertising and the time of sale, which of course will be satisfactorily accounted for, when reference is made to the Treasurer's Books.—See lists marked T.
