A CURSE FOR THE CHOLERA.—We had begun to fear that this formidable pestilence for which so many preparations were made, and for the arrival of which so many of our medical friends waited with impatience, was about to leave us as ignorant of its treatment as it found us.

The gentleman who first applied this new remedy, the original proposer having been Dr. O'Shaghnessy of London. The latter physician, it seems, was struck with the remarkable deficiency in the serum of the blood remaining in the body of a cholera patient.

A patient is lying in the lowest stage of collapse. The pulse is gone, the breathing oppressed, and the only indication of vitality is an occasional paroxysm of spasm. A vein is opened, and the point of syringe being introduced, salt and water, of blood heat, is slowly pumped in, six or ten pounds being transfused, as it is called.
