EXTRACTS. From late English Papers received at the Office of the Upper Canada Herald. VISITATION AND CONFIRMATION. Yesterday week the Lord Bishop of this diocese administered the rite of confirmation to about 1,100 children, at the Collegiate Church, Manchester, after which his lordship held his solemn benediction at the same place.

PUNISHMENT OF DEATH BILL.—We learn with regret from the following letter, which has been received by Mr. Phillips, the solicitor, from our worthy representative, Mr. Ewart, that the alterations introduced by the House of Lords, in the bill for the abolition of capital punishment are likely to prove fatal to the whole measure.

DISCOVERY OF A MURDERER ON BOARD. The melancholy affliction which occasioned the return of the Brutus to this port has been the providential means of securing a man, who has to all appearance, been engaged in the murder of one of his fellow countrymen.

THE BANK CHARTER. In answer to a question, from Mr. Gibson, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, that when he proposed the appointment of a committee, he did so with a sanguine expectation of being able to introduce some measure on the subject during the present session, but the course which the examination of evidence in the Committee had taken, had diminished the expectation which he previously entertained.

CASE OF SOMERVILLE. Mr. HUME called the attention of the House to the petition from the editor of the Weekly Dispatch, which he had presented ten days ago, containing the names of a private in the Scotch Greys, named Somerville, who had been flogged according to the sentence of a court martial, ostensibly for a breach of discipline, but in reality for writing a letter to the Weekly Dispatch, expressing certain political opinions which were not palatable to his officers.

THE RACE HORSE EUPHRATES.—This famous horse was shot a few days ago, and repined, by Mr. Walker, of the Lead-Works, in Chester, whom he was presented by Mr. Mytton. He is buried in a field near the shot tower, and over his remains is a stone, bearing the following inscription.—EUPHRATES—a ch. horse, bred by Quiz, dan Persopolis, by Alexander, foaled in 1816 after proving himself one of the best horses of the day, and the winner of 19 Gold Cups, was buried here the 16th day of June, 1832, and this stone is erected to mark the spot by his last owner, FRANK WALKER.

PUNISHMENT OF A DEATH BILL. Mr. Ewart hoped he might be allowed to-morrow (Wednesday) to call the attention of the House to the amendments made by the House of Lords in the Punishment of Death Bill. The circuits were about to commence, and many of the Judges had expressed a wish that the Bill should pass before they proceeded on circuit.

EDITH HANGING BILL.—We learn from the Jamaica papers, that an indictment was recently preferred against Mr. Edward Jordan, editor of the Jamaica Watchman, charging him with inserting an article in his paper calculated to excite the slaves to insurrection. He was acquitted. A bill has been since hurried through the House of Assembly, making it capital felony, punishable with death, for the editor of any paper to print or publish any thing which can be supposed to have a tendency to excite the slave or free population to acts of insurrection.

OBSERVANCE OF THE SABBATH. On the motion of Sir A. Agnew a select committee was appointed to devise means for enforcing a better observance of the Sabbath in the metropolis.

CURRAN AND THE MILLER'S DOG. Curran told me with infinite humour, of an adventure between him and a mastiff when he was a boy. He had heard somebody say that any person throwing the skirts of his coat over his head, stopping long, holding out his arms, and creeping along backward, might frighten the fiercest dog and put him to flight. He accordingly made the attempt on a miller's animal in the neighbourhood, who would never let the boys rob the orchard; but found to his sorrow that he had a dog to deal with who did not care which end of a good bit out of it.

ANECDOTE OF CATALANI.—When Captain Montague was cruising off Brighton, Madame Catalani was invited, with other ladies, to a brilliant fete on board his frigate. The captain went in his launch on shore, manned by more than twenty men, to escort the fair freight on board, and as the boat was cutting through the waves, Madame Catalani without any previous notice, commenced the air Rule Britannia. Had a voice from the great deep spoken, the effect could not have been more instantaneous and sublime. The sailors, not knowing whom they were rowing, were so astonished and enchanted into inactivity, that with one accord they rested upon their oars, while tears trembled in the eyes of many of them.

PITCAIRN'S ISLAND.—The inhabitants of Pitcairn's Island who lately emigrated in a body, in consequence of the scarcity of water on their own island, to Otaheite, being shocked at the licentiousness of manners which prevailed there, and having suffered severely from sickness, twelve of their number having died, have been all reconveyed to their former residence. They were transported back by Captain Driver, of the brig Charles Dagg, of Salem. The number when conveyed to Otaheite, was 87. [American Paper.]

HIGHEST TAVERN EUROPE.—A tavern has been built on the summit of Mount Faulhorn, in Switzerland; it stands at an elevation of 8,140 feet above the level of the sea, and is, therefore between five and six hundred feet higher than the Hospice of the Great St. Bernard. Morton, the play-writer, in his examination before a committee of the House of Commons, to enquire into the state of dramatic literature and the major and minor theatres, asserted on Thursday, that the weekly expenses of the two metropolitan houses amounted to three thousand pounds.
