FLINDALL'S REFLECTIONS OF A CONTEMPORARY.
Humble as a country Inn may often appear, Dycho tells us, that Inn, was the ancient name of Noblemen's and Bishops' great houses, as well as to those now applied to certain colleges, or places where students and practitioners of the law reside. According to British law, a traveller, or guest, must first tender the money for his entertainment, before he can have any legal ground of complaint. An innkeeper is also allowed to detain the traveller, or horse, or the goods of his guest, till payment is made to the innkeeper. It is often the credulity or benevolence of a tavern or innkeeper imposed on by the traveller in a land of strangers, with nothing but a sorrowful heart and an empty purse, to be repaid from him by the disgust and suspicion occasioned by the frequent frauds practiced by knaves or cheats! The unreasonable expectations also, of travellers, is often the sole cause of their discontent: "I would rather wait on twenty gentlemen than on one Innkeeper." I was once at a small Inn some distance from home, when a witless young coxcomb, in his best clothes, entered, he wished to appear "somebody," and called for costly articles, which he had reason to expect could not be provided, and this with the most swaggering and ridiculous importance; ordering a decent old man, the landlord, to "step round," with an insolence which made me heartily wish to have replied to it with a horse whip! The old man looking sternly at him, asked if he was not Mr. W——'s tenant, and was answered yes; only then said the landlord you are the fellow who slunk away from my house last year, without paying your bill! His high mightiness, (now the sport of the comedian) after striking the peasant, and exclaiming "a tumbling in his pocket book, could find but fourpence! Happy might the landlord's lot could be always distinguish the rogue, or exclude the churlish wrangler, the petulant, the peevish, and proud! for the social good humor of the guest, is sure to inspire his host with the same feeling.

Many well meaning people have lately fallen into the fashion of reviling Inns or taverns, as scenes only of vice or intemperance. It is nevertheless true that drunkenness, madness and mischief are so nearly allied that no moral man can be its advocate. Drunkenness, has been very aptly termed a "social vice," and the happy people of resort to the honest villagers. "Shall it no more impart an hour's importance to the poor man's heart?" or is he alone to be censured, who cannot afford to elevate his spirits on wine!

An Inn is often found an epitome of the world, as well as a resting place for the weary traveller: here we often enjoy "the best of reason and the flow of joy!" It is here that we often accidentally and joyfully meet with a long lost friend; or perhaps a relative from a distant land: here it is that new friendships are formed; that desirable bargains are often made, and joy and ease away to us. We read that even the apostle after his shipwreck, felt exhilarated when in view of "the three taverns which when Paul saw he thanked God and took courage."
