THE HON. JUDGE SHERWOOD'S CHARGE TO THE GRAND JURY.

Gentlemen of the Grand Jury, there is great reason to hope that, very few, and perhaps no bill, for capital offences, will be preferred for your consideration at the present Assizes...

The Calendar of the Gaol does not contain any charge so extraordinary in its nature as to call for a particular comment from the Court.

I perceive several cases of larceny in the calendar, and I regret to observe that this offence is of frequent occurrence in this Province.

The rapid increase of population which brings together every description of persons may be one cause of the frequent commission of this crime.

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It is a crime, and a particularly heinous one, to make a disgraceful nature, that I think it almost impossible for any one who has received a moral and religious education to a considerable extent, to be a noble example of Scotland, in her mode of diffusing education throughout the great mass of the population.
