THE following is the American account, contained in a Message from the Governor of Maine to the Legislature. A Proclamation by Sir John Harvey follows.

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE. The following message was sent in by the Secretary of State to the House of Representatives: I comply with the House of Representatives, I have in relation to the reported outbreak of the Land Agent.

A PROCLAMATION. For the U. C. Herald. The present state of alarm and excitement is a matter that demands our most serious consideration—I cannot account for it, but it appears to me not to receive such a calm and necessary investigation as it requires.

Such things as these they hasten to lay before their readers in the manner they receive them—thus they have them; and nothing is thought of but warlike preparations, seldom if ever do they offer any arguments to show the impracticability of carrying such a line into effect, or reason with those who have or ought to have the means of putting a final stop to such disgraceful doings. I believe there have been more wars drawn and battles fought between those warring newspapers of both frontiers, than probably we shall ever witness in our time.
