The same alterations and regulation scribed above will be established at all the other gates, but with this difference, that half the Toll may be paid going, and the other half returning.—And also, at Gate No. 2, near Waterloo, the Tollage going and coming from McGuin's Mills will be the same as the rates imposed on Travellers by the Bath Road at Kingston Gate.
