of Elijah Middleton. This structure

was built by Horatio Robeson as a

tannery, and as such was used by him

and others for a number of years.

Then it was converted into a butter

factory and shingle mill, the

motor power being a 12-horse-power

engine. Although the machinery in the

mill is now very complete, additions

will be made to the plant in the spring,

the design being to turn out sashes

next season.

THE CARDING, SPINNING AND WEAV-  
ING MILL

of J. H. and H. O. Gordon is in the

old building erected by Joshua Bates

about the year 1840. As stated in last

week's REPORTER, the owners and oc-  
cupiers of this factory have been many,but when some five years ago the pro-  
perty passed into the hands of the

Gordons, the good reputation of the

firm (who had carried on carding and

fulling for years at Lyndhurst) had

preceded them, and the business began

at once to assume the position of a

leading Farmersville industry. Early

in 1886 the proprietors purchased new

carding, spinning and weaving ma-  
chinery, and when the season opened

they were ready for business on a large

scale. The firm were fortunate in

securing the services of J. H. Hawkins,

Port Hope, as head spinner, and of

Thos. Mitchell as head weaver—men

thoroughly posted in their respective

departments. We learn that the mill

turned out over 1,400 yards of flannels

and tweds during the season, and that

the capacity of the factory is only half

what the requirements of the business

demand. The machinery is driven by

a fine new 20-horse-power engine, and

there is also a water-power capable
