\$1,500,000 Worth of Property Ruined by an ler Gorge.

A St. Louis despatch says: The io gorge, which has formed in the Mississippi River in front of this city, began to move at midnight and drifted down the stream, three hundred yards, lifting two steamers out of the water, slightly injuring them, when the immense weight was checked and remained intact. At 10 o'clock this morning, when the January thaw loosened the mass, it slowly crushed down upon nearly \$1,500,000 worth of property, which it is now slowly grinding into ruins. Already several barges have been sunk, and the steamers Tamma, Mattie Belle and the Hayes have beeen sunk. The Hayes was a large excursion steamer worth \$25,000, and is a total wreck.
