Playing a Piece of Music. Science, says Sir James Pages, will aug ly the natural man with wonders u ounted. The author had once heard Mdile anotha play a presto by Mendelssohn. Sh played 5,595 notes in four minutes and hree seconds. Every one of these notes involved certain movements of a finger, at east two, and many of them involved additional movement laterally as well as those up and down. They also involved repeated movements of the wrists, clbows and arms, cays a writer in the " Popular loience Monthly," altogether probably not less shan one movement for each time.

Therefore there were three distinct ovements for each note. As there were twenty-four notes per second, and each of these notes involved three distinct musical movements, that amounted to pertain force as a certain time and with a certain duration. Therefore, there were four distinct qualities in each of the 72 movements in each second.
