Council.

The Brookville & Westport Railway
Company is asking a bonus of \$5,000
from the township of South Sherbrooke.

If a bill now before the Ontario

A new temperance organization has

Roman Catholic congregation, Smith's
Falls.

It was rumored to-day that the
right to build the Kingston and Smith's
Falls railroad has been purchased by
